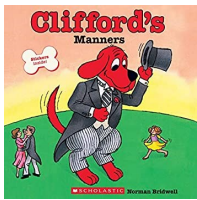

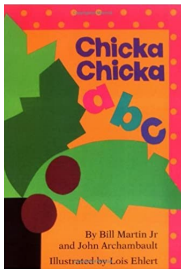
## Entering Kindergarten Grade BOOKLIST & PROJECT

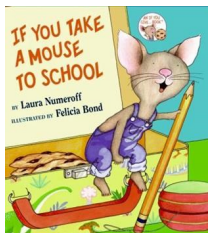
### Clifford's Manners–Norman Bridwell

### Chicka Chicka ABC–Bill Martin Jr. & John Archambault

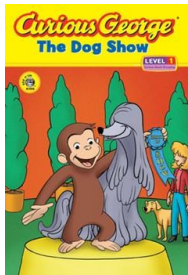
